

**VICTORIAN CIVIL AND ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL
GUARDIANSHIP LIST**

Proceeding in relation to Lynette Croll under:

Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 1998 Section 80 directions.

1. The proceeding is adjourned to a date and time to be fixed by the principal registrar to be heard by R Scott, Senior Member of the *Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal*, if available.
2. The proceeding is adjourned to enable the Public Advocate to investigate the issues of disability and whether the proposed represented person needs a guardian or an administrator. The Public Advocate is to provide a report to the Tribunal.

Pursuant to Schedule 1 Part 9 clause 35(1) of the *Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal Act 1998* the Tribunal gives the following directions:

- (a) The Public Advocate is to consult with Dr Lindsay Vowels, Dr Craig Clarke and Dr Dhillon and provide the doctors with copies of the following:
 - (i) Affidavit of Trevor Croll, sworn 5 May 2004;
 - (ii) Statutory Declaration of Lynette Croll, declared on 18 March 2004 together with attachments to the Statutory Declaration;
 - (iii) The applicants' letter to the Registrar of VCAT dated 25 February 2004;
 - (iv) Southern Health medical records contained in the Tribunal file including the report of Ms Patricia Sheridan; and
 - (v) Circulate each of the reports between the doctors.

The Tribunal notes that the proposed represented person has stated to the Tribunal that she agrees to be:

- (a) Assessed by a geriatrician nominated by the Public Advocate if the Public Advocate considers such an assessment is necessary. The parties to the proceeding are not to have any involvement in the nomination of the doctor to carry out the assessment and the doctor is not to be known to any of the parties.
- (b) Reassessed by Dr Lindsay Vowels should Dr Lindsay Vowels consider it necessary to do so.
